The idea of Unpeeling/施 started with one of the artist's grandma's after dinner habits - peeling oranges and share them with her family. The act of peeling oranges symbolize sharing, connecting and healing. Peeling the orange reveal the vulnerable center, and metaphorically this action exposes the artist desire to promotion sharing. Lo sees her art as another form of prayer. Every painting, video and installation is a form of resting and healing.
